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1. About South Australian Institute of Business and Technology

South Australian Institute of Business and Technology (SAIBT) diplomas lead into Year 2 of most undergraduate degree programs at the University of South Australia. SAIBT academic classes usually have no more than 40 students. All programs are taught by lecturers approved by the University. Students can benefit from 3 intakes per year at SAIBT – February, June and October. Students can complete their Diploma Stage 2 studies within 2 trimesters or 8 months. SAIBT is located on the University of South Australia's City East Campus in the Adelaide CBD. SAIBT students have access to all of the University facilities including the gym, library, bookshops, cafes and lots more.

- Applicants with higher education study are eligible to apply for Diploma program entry and have their previous study assessed for advanced standing (RPL):

Before starting your application:

- Choose which program and degree you want to study, and the intake you wish to commence your studies.
- Ensure you have electronic copies of your academic transcripts, which you will need to attach to your online application.

Once applicants have submitted their application, it generally takes between 24-48 hours to receive a response.

5. Enrolment

- How to accept your offer:
 - Ensure you first meet all conditions of enrolment
 - Complete the Student Acceptance and Payment Agreement - return signed Student Acceptance together with your payment to Admissions
 - Admissions will then confirm your enrolment, and provide information about Orientation

- How to enrol:
 1. Log into the Student Portal and Select Enrolment
 2. Choose your Program (you will only have one option)
 3. Choose your Courses/Modules
 4. Confirm financial charges and select FINALISE
 5. Review your enrolment
 6. Update your details – you may be asked to update your profile
 7. You are required to complete your SAIBT Diploma in the number of trimesters shown on your offer.
 8. International students must have a minimum 75% study load each trimester (3 or 4 courses), this can be less in your final trimester. Domestic students can study less.
 9. You must enrol in Stage 1 courses before you can enrol in Stage 2 courses
 10. You must complete pre-requisite courses first

11. Every student has a personalised study plan based on their previous academic study. This means you may be required to do a different selection of courses to other students.
